Shasta Lightning Complex Update

Saturday, July 26, 2008 9:00 a.m.

Acres Burned: 86,500 **Percent Contained:** 100%

Cause: Lightning

Incident Begin Date: 6/21/08 @ 5 a.m. and into the afternoon

Containment Date: 7/25/08 @ 6 p.m.

Current Situation: All fires on the Shasta Lightning Complex have been 100% contained. However, firefighters will be patrolling and mopping up the hot spots on all fires. The fire areas are still hazardous and the general public is reminded that equipment and firefighters will remain in the fire areas for the next several weeks until all these fires are completely out. Firefighting activities include fireline suppression repair, and the backhaul of equipment and trash. There is an estimated 10,000 feet of fire hose remaining on the line that will need to be hauled out, cleaned, and rolled to be ready for any future firefighting. Demobilization of surplus resources is continuing. The Complex transitioned back to the Shasta – Trinity Unit on Wednesday, July 23, 2008.
